Homeland Security Program

- Purpose of Homeland Security Grants
- Suite of grant programs for specific purposes
- Conditions – 80 percent pass through to counties; City and County receives 100 percent of the Urban Area Security funding
- All funds must be aligned to an investment. The investment focuses on building capability
- Changes exceeding 10 percent of project requires Department of Homeland Security approval

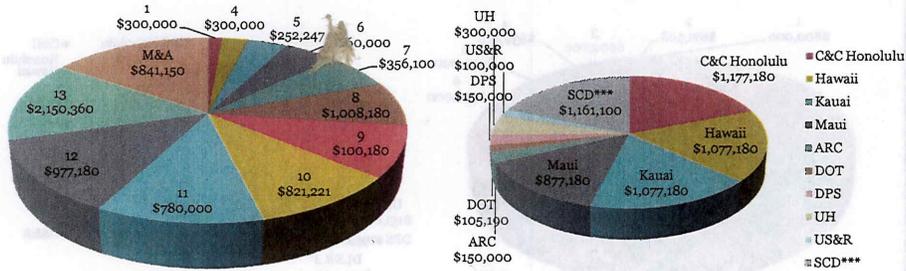
## State Homeland Security Grant Program

SHSP supports the implementation of State Homeland Security Strategies to address the identified planning, organization, equipment, training, and exercise needs to prevent, protect against, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism and other catastrophic events. In addition, SHSP supports the implementation of the *National Preparedness Guidelines*, the *National Incident Management System (NIMS)*, and the *National Response Framework (NRF)*.

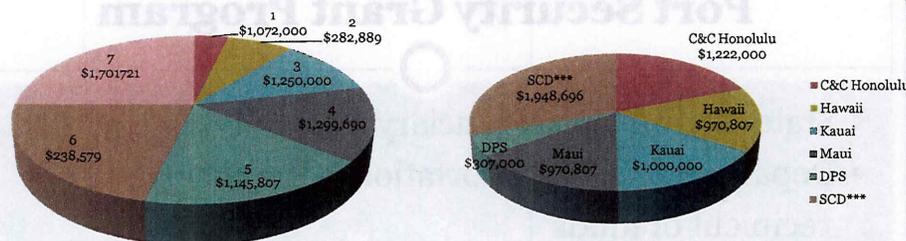

### FY 2008 Homeland Security Program



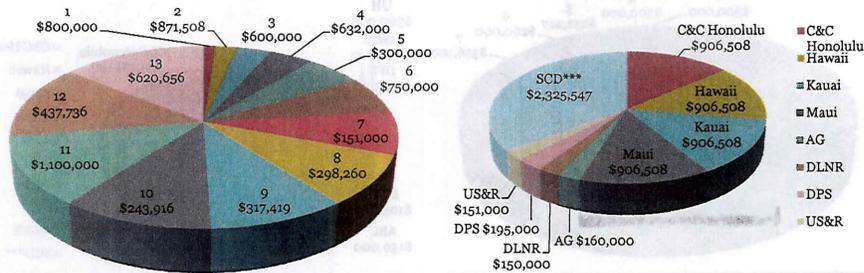

## Port Security Grant Program

- State Civil Defense Fiduciary Agent
- Department of Transportation is the sub-grantee/ recipient of funds
- Port Security Grant has four major focuses
- Since 2008, Port of Honolulu includes all 10 commercial ports
- FY 2008 and 2009 required a 25 percent match
- FY 2010 no match

## Port Security Grant Program Focus Areas

- Enhancing Maritime Domain Awareness
- Enhancing Improvised Explosive Device (IED) and Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear, Explosive (CBRNE) prevention, protection, response and recovery capabilities
- Training and Exercises
- Efforts supporting implementation of the Transportation Worker Identification Credential (TWIC)
