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**Bill No. and Title:** House Bill No. 1280, HD1 Relating to Public Safety

**Purpose:** Requires the department of public safety to form a working group to define and delineate the duties and responsibilities of process servers under its jurisdiction, create a process to obtain certification for the sheriff division from the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc., to ensure that proper law enforcement policies and procedures are enacted and followed, create a process of registration for process servicers in the state, and address other issues deemed relevant by the working group or by the department of public safety. Requires a report to the legislature.

**Judiciary's Position:**

The Judiciary supports this bill, so long as it is read in conjunction with HB 951, HD 1. We understand that the House Draft 1 of HB 951 will delete the language permitting civil process servers to be authorized by the courts. As we have testified on HB 951, we have great concerns about court authorization of civil process servers. However, once that bill is amended (as discussed during decision making) to authorize the department of public safety to name civil process servers, we agree that having a working group determine the duties and responsibilities



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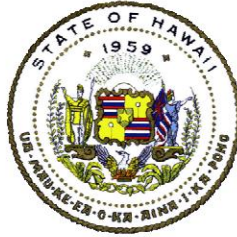
of civil process servers and a process for obtaining certification for these process servers, is a prudent approach.

We appreciate the inclusion of representation from the department of commerce and consumer affairs (DCCA) as part of the working group, given that the registration and certification of process servers (like that of bondsmen, detectives and investigators regulated by statute) may best be accomplished through DCCA. The Judiciary looks forward to collaborating with the working group.

Again, however, we note that HB 1280, HD1 presents a long-term solution to the present problem and will only work if a short-term solution (as provided through HB 951, HD1) is also enacted.
