

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE FOUNDATION ON CULTURE AND THE ARTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The auditor shall conduct a financial and
- 2 management audit of the state foundation on culture and the arts
- 3 that shall include but not be limited to determining:
- 4 (1) The remaining balance within the works of art special
- 5 fund;
- 6 (2) The amount and source of funds transferred into the
- 7 works of art special fund;
- 8 (3) The total annual expenditures incurred for the
- 9 acquisition of works of art;
- 10 (4) The total annual operating costs, along with a
- 11 detailed breakdown of these costs, for the state
- 12 foundation on culture and the arts;
- 13 (5) Costs associated with site modifications, display, and
- 14 interpretive work for the exhibition of works of art;
- 15 (6) Costs associated with upkeep services, including
- 16 maintenance, repair, and restoration of works of art;
- 17 (7) The methodology used for obtaining works of art;



- 1 (8) The current inventory of acquired works of art under
- 2 the control of and maintained by the state foundation
- 3 on culture and the arts;
- 4 (9) The methodology and systems currently used to monitor
- 5 and secure the inventory of acquired works of art;
- 6 (10) Best management practices for the state foundation on
- 7 culture and the arts;
- 8 (11) Whether the current, independent financial audit
- 9 performed annually for the state foundation on culture
- 10 and the arts, its affiliates, or pass through
- 11 entities, is substandard; and
- 12 (12) The specific amounts of money:
- 13 (A) Spent by the department of transportation on
- 14 capital improvement construction for the
- 15 enhancement of airport facilities;
- 16 (B) Being deposited into the works of art special
- 17 fund as required by law; and
- 18 (C) Being used from the works of art special fund
- 19 solely to purchase works of art for these airport
- 20 facilities.

21 SECTION 2. The auditor shall submit a report of the

22 auditor's findings and any recommendations regarding the



1 financial and management audit of the state foundation on
2 culture and the arts, including any proposed legislation, to the
3 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
4 the regular session of 2015.

5 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
