
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ANIMALS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that persons who are
2 cruel to animals are more likely to commit other crimes of
3 violence against people, based on extensive research in the
4 fields of criminology and psychology.

5 Act 262, Session Laws of Hawaii 1985, relating to
6 forfeiture of animals for cruelty to animals (enacted as section
7 711-1110.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes), provides in pertinent part
8 that the court may order the defendant to surrender or forfeit
9 the animal whose treatment was the basis of the conviction or
10 plea, as well as any other animals under the possession,
11 custody, or control of the defendant, to the custody of a duly
12 incorporated humane society or duly incorporated society for the
13 prevention of cruelty to animals. The intent of Act 262 is to
14 temporarily protect abused animals from further harm.

15 Notwithstanding Act 262, there have been numerous instances
16 where defendants who have been convicted of cruelty to animals
17 in the first or second degree, in some cases involving dozens of



1 animals, have been allowed to continue to own animals and to
2 sometimes sell the animals for profit.

3 More than thirty states have enacted laws to prohibit
4 possessing, owning, or residing with animals upon conviction of
5 a cruelty to animal offense.

6 The purpose of this Act is to prohibit persons convicted of
7 cruelty to animals in the first or second degree from
8 possessing, owning, or residing with any animal for not less
9 than a specified number of years from the date of conviction.

10 SECTION 2. Section 711-1108.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11 amended by amending subsection (5) to read as follows:

12 "(5) Cruelty to animals in the first degree is a class C
13 felony. In addition to any fines and imprisonment imposed under
14 this section, any person convicted under this section shall be
15 prohibited from possessing, owning, or residing with any pet
16 animal for a minimum of five years from the date of conviction."

17 SECTION 3. Section 711-1109, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
18 amended by amending subsection (4) to read as follows:

19 "(4) Cruelty to animals in the second degree is a
20 misdemeanor. In addition to any fines and imprisonment imposed
21 under this section, any person convicted under this section
22 shall be prohibited from possessing, owning, or residing with



1 any pet animal for a minimum of one year from the date of
2 conviction."

3 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
4 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
5 begun before its effective date.

6 SECTION 5. If any provision of this Act, or the
7 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held
8 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
9 applications of the Act that can be given effect without the
10 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
11 of this Act are severable.

12 SECTION 6. New statutory material is underscored.

13 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2112.

Prohibits persons convicted of cruelty to animals in the first degree and second degree from possessing, owning, or residing with any pet animal for a minimum of five years and one year, respectively, from the conviction date. Effective 01/01/2112.
