
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's sex
2 offender registry is intended to provide public information on
3 sex offenders. This registry allows the public to keep track of
4 and look up sex offenders living in their communities. The
5 required information includes the sex offender's place of
6 employment and any volunteer activity. The legislature further
7 finds that the registry currently does not specify whether the
8 sex offender's employment or volunteer activity includes
9 substantial contact with children.

10 The purpose of this Act is to amend Hawaii's sex offender
11 registry laws to require sex offenders to disclose whether their
12 place of employment or volunteer activity involves substantial
13 contact with persons under the age of eighteen.

14 SECTION 2. Section 846E-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15 amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows:

16 "(d) Registration information for each covered offender
17 shall include a signed statement by the covered offender
18 containing:



- 1 (1) The name, all prior names, nicknames and pseudonyms,
2 and all aliases used by the covered offender or under
3 which the covered offender has been known and other
4 identifying information, including date of birth and
5 any alias date of birth, social security number and
6 any alias social security number, sex, race, height,
7 weight, and hair and eye color;
- 8 (2) The actual address and telephone number of the covered
9 offender's residence or any current, temporary address
10 where the covered offender resides, or if an address
11 is not available, a description of the place or area
12 in which the covered offender resides for at least
13 thirty nonconsecutive days within a sixty-day period,
14 and for each address or place where the covered
15 offender resides, how long the covered offender has
16 resided there;
- 17 (3) The actual address or description of the place or
18 area, the actual length of time of the stay, and
19 telephone number where the covered offender is staying
20 for a period of more than ten days, if other than the
21 stated residence;



- 1 (4) If known, the future address and telephone number
2 where the covered offender is planning to reside, if
3 other than the stated residence;
- 4 (5) Any electronic mail address, any instant message name,
5 any internet designation or moniker, and any internet
6 address used for routing or self-identification;
- 7 (6) Any cell phone number and other designations used for
8 routing or self-identification in telephonic
9 communications;
- 10 (7) Names and, if known, actual business addresses of
11 current and known future employers, including
12 information for any place where the covered offender
13 works as a volunteer or otherwise works without
14 remuneration, and the starting and ending dates of any
15 such employment;
- 16 (8) A statement indicating whether the covered offender's
17 place of employment or volunteer activity includes
18 substantial contact with persons under the age of
19 eighteen;
- 20 [+8+] (9) For covered offenders who may not have a fixed
21 place of employment, a description of the places where
22 such a covered offender works, such as information



1 about normal travel routes or the general area or
2 areas in which the covered offender works;
3 ~~[(9)]~~ (10) Professional licenses held by the covered
4 offender;
5 ~~[(10)]~~ (11) Names and actual addresses of current and known
6 future educational institutions with which the covered
7 offender is affiliated in any way, whether or not
8 compensated, including but not limited to affiliation
9 as a faculty member, an employee, or a student, and
10 the starting and ending dates of any such affiliation;
11 ~~[(11)]~~ (12) The year, make, model, color, and license or
12 registration or other identifying number of all
13 vehicles, including automobiles, watercrafts, and
14 aircrafts, currently owned or operated by the covered
15 offender and the address or description of the place
16 or places where the covered offender's vehicle or
17 vehicles are habitually parked, docked, or otherwise
18 kept;
19 ~~[(12)]~~ (13) Passports and information about the passports, if
20 the covered offender has passports, and documents
21 establishing immigration status and information about
22 these documents, if the covered offender is an alien;



1 ~~[(13)]~~ (14) A statement listing all covered offenses for
2 which the covered offender has been convicted or found
3 unfit to proceed or acquitted pursuant to chapter 704;

4 ~~[(14)]~~ (15) A statement indicating whether the covered
5 offender has received or is currently receiving
6 treatment ordered by a court of competent jurisdiction
7 or by the Hawaii paroling authority;

8 ~~[(15)]~~ (16) A statement indicating whether the covered
9 offender is a United States citizen; and

10 ~~[(16)]~~ (17) Any additional identifying information about the
11 covered offender."

12 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
13 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
14 begun before its effective date.

15 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

17 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2013.
