Amends language to require each director of central personnel agency for a jurisdiction to review state civil service positions exempted under section 76-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, on or after July 1, 2002, and prior to July 1, 2014, to determine whether the positions should continue to be exempt. Amends the positions that are exempt from civil service. Requires the Director of Human Resources Development to submit a report to the legislature.</p>	<p>LAB, FIN</p>

<p><u>SB 181, SD1</u> <u>(HSCR1114)</u> <u>Status</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO VETERANS. Allows the department of education to continue, until June 30, 2020, awarding high school diplomas to qualified veterans who did not receive a high school diploma as a result of compulsory induction into active service in the armed services of the United States or any person whose high school education was interrupted due to wartime practices such as internment during World War II.</p>	<p>VMI, EDN, FIN</p>
<p><u>SB 1101, SD1, HD2</u> <u>(HSCR1150)</u> <u>Status</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO THE HAWAII PUBLIC HOUSING AUTHORITY. Status

RELATING TO TAXATION.
Ensures that certain eligible housing projects will remain affordable for certain minimum periods in order to be certified for exemption from general excise taxes.

Status

RELATING TO THE RENTAL HOUSING TRUST FUND.
Authorizes the Rental Housing Trust Fund to be used for spaces for public uses within mixed-use residential developments in which the residential component is the primary use and qualifies as an eligible rental housing project.

PAPER: 2 copies (including an original) to Room 306 in the State Capitol;


