<a href="#"><u>SB 766</u></a> <a href="#"><u>Status &amp; Testimony</u></a>	RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION. Requires that a physician selected and paid for by an employer to conduct a medical examination for workers' compensation purposes shall be actively treating at least ten patients in a one-month period; be actively treating at least 50 per cent of the physician's total patient load in a one-month period; and possess medical malpractice insurance. Defines "actively treating".	HTH, JDL
<a href="#"><u>SB 1174</u></a> <a href="#"><u>Status &amp; Testimony</u></a>	RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION. Provides that a independent medical examination and permanent impairment rating examination shall be conducted by a qualified physician selected by the mutual agreement of the parties. Provides a process for appointment in the event that there is no mutual agreement.	HTH, JDL
