<u>HB 253, HD2</u> <u>(HSCR890)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO VACCINATIONS. Authorizes pharmacists to administer vaccines to persons between 14 and 17 years of age who have a valid prescription from the patient's medical home. (HB253 HD2)	HTH, CPN
<u>HB 354, HD2</u> <u>(HSCR748)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO NURSES. Beginning with the July 1, 2017, licensing biennium, requires licensed registered nurses and licensed practical nurses to submit evidence of completed continuing competency requirements prior to the renewal of the license. <u>HB 586, HD2</u> <u>(HSCR878)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO USE OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS AND E-CIGARETTES ON HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS CORPORATION PREMISES. Prohibits the use of tobacco products and electronic smoking devices on premises of the facilities operated by the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation (HHSC). Requires HHSC to consult with collective bargaining units and provide at HHSC expense tobacco cessation programs to its public employees. (HB586 HD2)	HTH
<u>HB 631, HD2</u> <u>(HSCR899)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO CERTIFICATES OF BIRTH. Establishes the documentation required when requesting the Department of Health to issue a new birth certificate with a sex designation change. (HB631 HD2)	HTH, JDL
<u>HB 696, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR579)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT. Establishes the Hawaii Healthcare Workforce Advisory Board to help increase and strengthen the healthcare workforce in the State. (HB696 HD1)	HTH, JDL



<p>HB 940, HD1 (HSCR608) Status & Testimony</p>	<p>RELATING TO THE REGULATION OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS. Amends Chapter 328J, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to prohibit the use of electronic smoking devices in places where smoking is prohibited. (HB940 HD1)</p>	<p>HTH, CPN</p>
<p>HB 1063, HD2 (HSCR871) Status & Testimony</p>	<p>RELATING TO EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE. Appropriates moneys to operate an additional emergency medical services unit in the Moanalua, Aliamanu, Red Hill, Salt Lake, and Foster Village areas. (HB1063 HD2)</p>	<p>HTH, WAM</p>
<p>HB 1147, HD1 (HSCR901) Status & Testimony</p>	<p>RELATING TO HEALTH. Establishes a two-year pilot emergency services failsafe program to assist physicians and patients in obtaining a second medical opinion regarding diagnosis and treatment. Authorizes the Department of Health to convene a committee to create a forum related to patient advocacy in the emergency department setting. Appropriates funds for the pilot program. <p>HB 448, HD1 (HSCR615) Status & Testimony</p>	<p>RELATING TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE. Requires the Department of Health (DOH) to conduct reviews of domestic violence fatalities, near-deaths, and suicides. Authorizes DOH to enter into memoranda of understanding to obtain information relating to near-deaths resulting from intimate partner violence. (HB448 HD1)</p>	<p>HTH, JDL</p>

<p>HB 481, HD1 (HSCR711) Status & Testimony</p>	<p>RELATING TO HEALTH. (HB847 HD1)</p>	<p>HTH, WAM</p>
<p><u>HB 851, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR719)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO HEALTH. Appropriates funds to establish an advanced life support ambulance to be based in Puna on the island of Hawaii, including the acquisition of a vehicle and equipment and personnel costs for state-certified emergency medical services personnel. (HB851 HD1)</p>	<p>HTH, WAM</p>
<p><u>HB 1241, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR721)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO HEALTH. Appropriates funds for Department of Health lead poisoning prevention activities. (HB1241 HD1)</p>	<p>HTH, WAM</p>
