SB 1066, SD1
(SSCR639)
Status

RELATING TO THE UNIFORM INTERSTATE FAMILY
SUPPORT ACT.

HUS, JUD, FIN

Updates the Uniform Interstate Family Support Act to reflect requirements of the Hague Convention of the International Recovery of Child Support and Other Forms of Family Maintenance. Provides procedures for registration, recognition, enforcement, and modifications of support orders from countries that are parties to the convention. (SD1)

Status

RELATING TO AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAMS.

HUS, EDN, FIN

Establishes the R.E.A.C.H. (Resources for Enrichment, Athletics, Culture, and Health) program in the office of youth services to provide a standardized framework and funding for afterschool programs in public middle/intermediate schools. Establishes a special fund to receive fees and other moneys to supplement the costs of administering and operating the program. (SD1)

SB 384, SD2
(SSCR866)
Status

RELATING TO ADDRESS CONFIDENTIALITY.

HUS, JUD, FIN

Establishes the address confidentiality program to help victims of domestic violence and sexual assault relocate and keep their addresses confidential. Creates the address confidentiality program surcharge fund. Effective 01/07/2059. (SD2)

SB 752, SD1
(SSCR775)
Status

RELATING TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.

HUS, CPC, JUD

Authorizes the Family Court to issue an order requiring wireless telecommunications service providers to transfer billing authority and rights to phone numbers to petitioners who are domestic abuse victims or to release petitioners who are domestic abuse victims from shared wireless plans. Effective 01/07/2059. (SD1)



SB 64, SD3
(SSCR784)
Status

RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES.
Makes appropriations for positions and the continued implementation of the preschool open doors program and for subsidies for the program. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD3)

SB 1014, SD1
(SSCR700)
Status

RELATING TO THE HOUSELESS BILL OF RIGHTS.
Defines specific rights granted to a person who is houseless including equal access to housing, jobs, and shelters, equal treatment by government agencies, and access to life-sustaining activities and essential services. Effective 01/07/2059. (SD1)

SB 1107
(SSCR724)
Status

MAKING AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION FOR GENERAL ASSISTANCE.
Makes an emergency appropriation from the general revenues of the State of Hawaii for fiscal year 2014-2015 to address the budget shortfall for the general support for the general assistance program (HMS 204) in the Department of Human Services. Effective upon approval.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- The date and time of the hearing; and
- Measure number.

While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:

FAX: For testimony less than 5 pages in length, transmit to 808-586-6311 (Oahu) or 1-800-535-3859 (for Neighbor Islander without a computer to submit testimony through e-mail or the Web); or

WEB: For testimony less than 10MB in size, transmit from <http://www.capitol.hawaii.gov/submittestimony.aspx>.

Testimony submitted will be placed on the legislative website. This public posting of testimony on the website should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.
