HB 1183  
Status

RELATING TO CAMPAIGN SPENDING.  
Creates program for comprehensive public funding of candidates for the offices of state senator and representative. Repeals the eligibility of candidates for the offices of state senator and representative for public funds under the existing partial public financing program. Appropriates funds to the campaign spending commission to prepare for the comprehensive public funding program in 2016, including staff support.

HB 1144  
Status

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE I OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF HAWAII RELATING TO THE RIGHTS OF VICTIMS OF CRIME.  
Proposes an amendment to the Hawaii State Constitution guaranteeing that victims of crime and their surviving immediate family members have specific rights related to information pertaining to and participation in the criminal justice process.

HB 327  
Status

RELATING TO CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS.  
Prohibits legislators and employees of legislators from holding any fundraiser during a regular legislative session or special session. Repeals \$25 per person contribution threshold for the applicability of fundraiser requirements and restrictions.

HB 1408, HD1  
(HSCR205)  
Status

RELATING TO PRIVATE ROADS.  
Requires the counties to repair and maintain private roads that have been previously maintained by the county and surrendered to the county after the absence of any act of private ownership over the road for five years. Requires the legislative body of a county to accept the dedication or surrender of a private road in cases where the private road is used by the public without restriction and has a history of being maintained by the county or State. (HB1408 HD1)

HB 813, HD1  
(HSCR215)  
Status

RELATING TO THE CODE OF ETHICS.  
Clarifies the fair treatment law by separating out certain limitations placed on task force members from those placed on legislators. Makes clear that legislators are not prohibited from taking action in the exercise of the legislator's legislative functions. (HB813 HD1)

HB 1199  
Status

RELATING TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.  
Requires law enforcement agencies to adopt and implement a written policy on domestic violence committed or allegedly committed by agency law enforcement officers. Establishes standards, training deadlines, administrative procedures, and reporting requirements.

### DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- The date and time of the hearing; and
- Measure number.

While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

WEB: For testimony less than 10MB in size, transmit from <http://www.capitol.hawaii.gov/submittestimony.aspx>.

Testimony submitted will be placed on the legislative website. This public posting of testimony on the website should be considered when including personal information in your testimony. Those wishing to provide oral testimony will be limited to two minutes.
