The following measure has been **ADDED** to the agenda: **HB1343**

<u>HB 456</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO POLICE DEPARTMENTS. Specifies that citizen complaints against a police officer that involve allegations of domestic abuse against a family or household member on the part of the police officer shall not be required to be in writing or sworn to by the complainant.	PBS, JUD
<u>HB 365</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO POLICE. Appropriates moneys as a grant-in-aid to the city and county of Honolulu to purchase body cameras for their police officers.	PBS, FIN
<u>HB 1344</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MITIGATION OF HAZARDOUS SITUATIONS. Authorizes two positions to oversee the mitigation of hazardous situations program in the department of defense and appropriates funding.	PBS, FIN
<u>HB 1343</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. Appropriates moneys for the establishment of a business recovery center within the department of defense.	EDB, PBS, FIN Pending floor vote

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- The date and time of the hearing; and
- Measure number.



While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

PAPER: 11 copies (including an original) to Room 422 in the State Capitol;


