The following measure(s) has been **DELETED** from the agenda: **HB1362**

<u>HB 812</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO LIGHTING. Requires that new and retrofitted street lights on state highways and roads be energy efficient. Requires that a portion of existing street lights be retrofitted with energy efficient lighting fixtures. Appropriates moneys.	TRN, FIN
<u>HB 1008</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO BLIND PEDESTRIAN SAFETY. Requires drivers of vehicles to exercise due care to ensure the safety of blind or visually handicapped on any roadway. Requires the examination for a driver's license to test the applicant's knowledge of operating a vehicle in a manner that ensures the safety of blind or visually impaired pedestrians.	TRN, JUD
<u>HB 1089</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. Requires motor vehicle safety inspections to be conducted every two years rather than annually.	TRN, CPC
<u>HB 970</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE INSPECTIONS. Expands authority of the Director of Transportation over required motor vehicle and motor carrier vehicle inspections in the State.	TRN, JUD
<u>HB 740</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATION. Authorizes the counties to enter into contracts with dealers and rental car companies for the registration of used cars.	TRN, JUD
<u>HB 1009</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SPECIAL INTEREST VEHICLES. Redefines "special interest vehicle" to mean a motor vehicle that, based on its model year, is at least 25 years old.	TRN, JUD



<u>HB 761</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. Prohibits heavy trucks from driving in the left-most lane of an interstate freeway except under certain conditions.	TRN, JUD
<u>HB 1007</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE DRIVER LICENSING. Authorizes the issuance of limited purpose driver's licenses, provisional licenses, and instruction permits for individuals who are otherwise eligible for a license or permit but do not present proof of authorized presence in the United States.	TRN, JUD
<u>HB 1362</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. Establishes penalties for theft or damage of airport concession supplies or inventory.	TRN, JUD
<u>HB 901</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO LAW ENFORCEMENT VEHICLES. Allows the Department of the Attorney General and the Harbors Division of the Department of Transportation to have law enforcement vehicles, with lights and sirens, that are recognized authorized emergency vehicles.	TRN, JUD
<u>HB 1011</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE TRAFFIC CODE. Defines dangerous wheels and prohibits their use.	TRN, JUD/CPC

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- The date and time of the hearing; and
- Measure number.

While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:
